

## Ohioans Can Enroll in Training and Earn a Credential at No Cost

The Individual Microcredential Assistance Program (IMAP) helps Ohioans who are low income, partially unemployed, or totally unemployed participate in a training program to receive a credential at no cost. IMAP providers offer training for over 80 different tech-focused credentials - many of which can be completed 100% online, meaning location is not a barrier.

IMAP training providers will cover all tuition, fees, and additional costs to help you learn new skills and earn a credential that can lead to a good job.

## Who can enroll?

To participate, you must be an Ohio resident who is low income, partially unemployed, or totally unemployed. Individual training programs may have additional requirements.

## How do I enroll?

Take these steps to get started today:

- 1. Visit Workforce.Ohio.gov/IMAP
- 2. Browse the list of credentials and choose the program that best fits your needs.
- 3. Contact the training provider(s) you are interested in to learn more.
- 4. Select a training provider and follow their application process to enroll in the program.
